The recruitment process

We have 2 stages of the recruitment:

- 1) Online application
- 2) In-person interview (a very relaxed chat, in a small group of 3-5 people)
- 3) 21 people are then offered a place on the course

Application top tips

We recruit the course cohort to reflect a diverse range of backgrounds and experience.

If you have *no prior experience*, we're interested to know what brings you to be interested in film/tv production now? And what other life experience or interests you have that you can bring to the course?

If you do have prior experience, we're interested to know how that has shaped your skills and your creative and personal development? And why you want to do this course in addition to what you have already done?

Preview of application questions

We encourage you to prepare your answers first and then paste them into the online application form (long-answer questions require 300 words maximum per answer)

- Please tell us about yourself, what interests you about the BFI Film Academy short course, and what difference you hope the Film Academy will make to you?
- Please tell us about your experience and/or interest in Film & TV. This could include your favourite film or television programme, or a class that you have taken at school, for example.
- If you were going to make a short, low budget **documentary** film, what would it be about?
 - (Tell us about the idea, who would be in the film and why you want to make it). You can view previous films we have made here <u>Watershed YouTube</u>
- Please tell us if you have any areas of interest in a particular film/tv production role
 - (Producing, Directing, Camera, Sound, Editing etc.....)
- Would you be open to learning a production role that may not be your first choice?
