Watershed and MAYK's Winter Residencies programme is a fantastic opportunity to develop and share ideas, to meet incredible people, to imagine, make and think. It is open to creative practitioners of any discipline, career stage and background, who have ideas for artistic projects exploring technology and climate breakdown. We have three residencies available. Each comes with a structured programme, work space at the Pervasive Media Studio, a network of peers, plus financial, technical and critical support. The programme will take place in Winter 2019/20 and we're flexible about how you structure your time. This is a remarkable opportunity to have time, resources and freedom to get an idea off the ground.

More about the programme and theme:

We're interested in artistic ideas exploring technology and climate breakdown. Global heating is causing weather-related disasters, rising sea levels, changes in food production, climate-related diseases and more. How does the climate crisis impact lives? And what role can technology play? We're looking for ideas underpinned by stories or experiences of people, from anywhere in the world, affected by climate crisis. Ideas could draw from historical, current or future fictional narratives, expressing any topic or mood, from grief and depression through to optimism and hope. Technology could form part of the narrative and/or the delivery mechanism. We're most interested in artworks that enable people to relate to what is happening, understand why it's essential that we act now and provoke action.

Our three Winter Residencies will encourage you to experiment, make, share and discuss your idea as it evolves. We offer a supportive space for this, with help from a Watershed Producer and Creative Technologist plus access to the expertise and networks of MAYK. This is a research and development programme, so we don't expect you to make a finished work. It is likely you will have a good story about the journey you've been on and some well-formed ideas. Towards the end of the residency we will invite you to share your 'work-in-progress' with the public. We'll work with you to find the right frame for your ideas and design an event that will help you move forwards.

We aim to be as inclusive as possible and work to accommodate all access requirements. We will openly discuss and tailor how we do things to support you as best we can.

At the end of the residency we will listen to your feedback, reflect on your journey and think about what your next steps could be.



— We offer:

- Time in residence at the Pervasive Media Studio supported by Watershed and MAYK
- A bursary of £2700 (tax inclusive) plus a £500 production budget
- Travel bursaries as needed
- The opportunity to focus intensively on the development of an idea
- Tailored support to help you get the most out of your time with us
- A hand-picked mentor drawn from the Studio or MAYK community
- A structured process featuring research blogs, regular catch ups, discussions and sharing events
- A peer community of potential collaborators for current and future projects

— About you

- You have a great idea and want to explore how to make it a reality.
- You have an open and curious approach to your own work and to the work of others in the Studio network.
- Your work will significantly develop through inclusion in the programme.
- You may be well versed in using technology, have tinkered, or have some great ideas but need help to get them off the ground, any approach is fine.

We feel that creating the conditions for amazing work to thrive is to bring together people who are different from one another, so we welcome applications from everyone. You could be just starting out, mid or late career, you could be pivoting in a creative direction or returning from a career break. All career stages, creative disciplines and backgrounds are welcome.

We ask for one project idea per application. You can make multiple applications if you have more than one idea.


You can apply as individuals or groups.

We welcome applications from BAME, LGBTQI, Deaf and disabled practitioners, because they are under represented in the programme.

The scheme is not aimed at undergraduate students, students in full time education, or those living outside of the UK.

— Where

You will be based at Watershed's Pervasive Media Studio and become part of our resident community of artists, creative companies, engineers, academics, scientists, technologists and tinkerers, who work on new and emerging ideas. Ideas span gaming, projections, location-based media, city intervention, connected objects, tangible interfaces and new forms of performance. Some are cultural, some are commercial. Run in partnership with the University of the West of England and the University of Bristol, the Studio has a great workspace, an open ethos and a can-do attitude.

We invite you to join, contribute to and learn from the Studio and MAYK communities, have desk space within the Studio, and access to meeting, event and quiet spaces. All spaces are accessible to wheelchairs.

Although the formal funded residency will come to a close in March 2020 your participation within the community can continue. At the end of the Residency programme we will review its value with you (as we do all Residents) and discuss the possibility of continued involvement, should you wish. In addition, all residents are welcome as hot deskers on an ongoing basis.

— What do we expect of you?

- Enthusiasm and ambition to grow and develop your practice.
- An open, curious, experimental approach
- Dedicated research time at the Pervasive Media Studio
- Regular online documentation of progress and ideas
- Participation in critiques, discussions and meetings with your mentor
- A willingness to contribute to the Studio and MAYK communities
- A sharing of ideas towards the end of the residency
- Some reflection and feedback on your time with us



Tips for making an application

We receive a lot of applications for our funded Residency programmes, so to make sure we really understand your proposition, we suggest you:

- Contact us if forms are not your thing, please don't be afraid to do this, we are super happy to discuss alternatives that would work better for you
- Create a biography that briefly summarises your practice, experience and any recent relevant projects
- Create a realistic proposal. It's quite a short residency so when planning your idea, think about what you would do with the time and how it might help you move forwards
- Be as concise as possible
- Be sure to explain what difference this would make to you and why you need to be at the Pervasive Media Studio to make it happen
- If you're planning to send links to share examples of work, choose good quality examples that are most relevant to your proposal
- Ask us questions if you need to

— How to apply

Over the past couple of years we've received some really useful feedback about the time and effort it takes for artists to apply to opportunities. So each year we tweak our application process in an attempt to be more respectful of time, and offer a useful experience to those who travel to attend interview. This year we've most radically changed our Stage One process. We've scrapped the word count and suggested 2-3 sides instead. We are continually testing our process and we welcome feedback.

Stage One

- A short biography
- What is the idea you want to develop?
- Why do you need to be resident at the Pervasive Media Studio to make this work?
- Any relevant links (optional)

The deadline for submissions is Wednesday 24 July 2019, 10am BST

We realise that text applications don't suit everyone, so if you would like discuss a different format or way to apply, please get in touch (details on page 10).

Stage Two

If you reach Stage Two, you will be asked to join us for a short Skype conversation. We will ask you to Skype even if you are local to Bristol. This will be an opportunity to discuss your practice and proposal. If you have access requirements there will be opportunity to discuss this at the time.

Stage Three

If you reach Stage Three, you will be invited to visit us at the Pervasive Media Studio. This will include a Studio tour, an interview and a chance to chat with a Studio resident. We'll talk to you before the visit about people you might like to meet and set up the conversation. To help you prepare, we will also send you the interview questions in advance. We will provide travel expenses and a £120 stipend (inclusive of tax) to those attending interview.

If you have access requirements there will be opportunity to discuss this prior to the visit.
